#### About our next Head of School

In her current role as the Associate Head at Wildwood School in Los Angeles, California (K-12, 750 students), Christina has had multiple opportunities to understand the role of Head. Having just arrived at Wildwood in July 2020, Christina became the school's Lead Pandemic Coordinator. She has overseen both curricular and co-curricular programming at Wildwood and has had direct involvement with college counseling, athletics, and community outreach. She is also part of Wildwood's DEIB Leadership Team and co-leads the DEIB Curriculum Committee.

Prior to Wildwood, Christina spent 10 years as Director of Maret's Middle School in Washington, DC where she oversaw the implementation of the division's social-emotional curriculum for 200 students, taught multiple courses, and established affinity groups.

Christina's girls' school background stems from her six years as Director of Studies and then Assistant Head of Upper School at Stone Ridge School of the Sacred Heart in Bethesda, Maryland, and her time as a dorm parent, coach, and teacher at The Masters School in Dobbs Ferry, New York. The institution she credits with having the most impact on her life, though, is her beloved Smith College. According to Christina, "At Smith, I found my voice."

With a B.A. in History from Smith, Christina also earned her M.A. in Education, Teaching, and Learning from the Harvard University Graduate School of Education and a Certificate in Administration and Supervision from the Johns Hopkins University School of Business and Education.
